Lesson 1

• Text: 1-3' דְּבַרִים ו

• The Directional Article (Review): Studies the grammatical structure used in Biblical Hebrew to denote movement toward a particular place or object, demonstrating its importance in understanding textual meaning.

• The Leitwort: Highlights the use of repeated key words or roots in the text to emphasize and develop central ideas, a technique identified by scholars like Buber and Rosenzweig.

• The Variants for the Word 'LAW': Explores the different Hebrew terms for 'law' and their subtle differences, showcasing how these words reflect various dimensions of divine instruction.

Lesson 2

• Text: 4-7' דְּבַרִים ו

• A Brief Discussion of the Text in Judaism: Examines the role of this passage in Jewish traditions, including its liturgical and cultural importance.

• The Root א.ה.ב: Investigates the meanings of this root, which include 'love,' 'loyalty,' and 'affection,' and how these concepts are conveyed in the text.

• מאד: Considers how this term, often used as an adverb meaning 'very' or 'exceedingly,' adds emphasis to descriptions in Hebrew.

• אינ.י: A surprising story of a root.

Lesson 3

• Text: 8-11' דְּבַרִים ו

• אַטָּשָׂר Explores this term, thought to refer to symbolic ornaments or markers, and its cultural and textual significance.

• אַזְאָרָא: Discusses the mezuzah, both as a physical object placed on doorposts and as a reflection of the commandment to inscribe the divine words on one's home.

• The Biblical 'Fear of Success': Reflects on the warning that prosperity might lead to spiritual neglect or forgetfulness.

Lesson 4

• Text: 12-15' דְּבַרִים ו



• בית עבדים: Explores the description of Egypt as a 'house of bondage,' emphasizing its significance as a metaphor for oppression and freedom.

• אלהים אחרים: Discusses the warning against following other gods and its relevance to the text's call for exclusive devotion.

- ובשמו תשבע: Is swearing in God's name allowed?

Lesson 5

• Text: 16-18' דְּבַרִים ו

• Masah and Meribah: Explores the narrative of testing God at Massah and its surprising implications.

• Edut: Analyzes this term as it relates to testimony and legal agreements in ancient contexts.

• Good and Decent: Examines this phrase as an idiom expressing integrity and uprightness.

Lesson 6

• Text: 19-22' דְּבַרִים ו

• הזקה: Studies the phrase 'mighty hand,' a metaphor borrowed from Egyptian royal literature, and its significance in the Exodus narrative.

• Root Formation: Explores examples of roots evolving into more complex forms, demonstrating linguistic development.

• BHS Variants: Discusses variations in Biblical manuscripts and their interpretive implications.

Lesson 7

• Text: 23-25' דְּבַרִים ו

• למען: Examines this term, used to express purpose or result, and its syntactic patterns in Biblical Hebrew.

• בצדקה: Explores the meanings of this term, ranging from justice to merit, and its application in the text.

• ליראה: Discusses this rare form derived from the verb 'to fear' and its nuanced implications in the text.
